Welcome to the 2023 SF Lux Awards! The San Francisco Section of the Illuminating Engineering Society's annual SF Lux Awards and Banquet celebrates the excellence of design, creativity and dynamic energy unique to our Bay Area lighting community. All projects in the SF Lux Awards are submitted for online judging in the IES North America Illumination Awards. The SF Lux Awards comprises projects by Bay Area firms that the IES San Francisco Section chooses for special recognition.



San Francisco Section

History of the San Francisco (Formerly Golden Gate) Section

In 1906 when the Illuminating Engineering Society was being organized, the Bay Area was recovering from an earthquake and fire. This prevented our local pioneers in illumination from immediate involvement. However, on 3 May 1907, amid San Francisco's ruins, a meeting was held at the temporary office of the Pacific Gas and Electric Company to consider forming a local Chapter. A temporary board was created with W.J. Miller as Chairman and W.H. Crim, Jr. as Secretary. The members were Professor Cory of the University of California, Romaine Meyers, Mr. Dollinger and Mr. Roach.

Romaine Meyers, an Oakland Engineer, became a "National Member" in 1913 and continued to advocate a local organization. In 1917 he was designated the "Western Representative of the Illuminating Engineering Society."

After the First World War ended, business and industry returned their attention to lighting and another attempt was made at a local organization. On 11 June, 1920 such a group was chartered and designated by the Society's Council as the "First Local Chapter" and in 1921 their Annual Report showed four meetings with an average attendance of 54 persons.

The IES Illumination Awards are comprised of four parallel program categories.

All projects receive levels of recognition attained by consensus judge scores.

Illumination Award for Interior Lighting Design *sponsored by Edwin F. Guth*

In 1902 Edwin F. Guth founded the St. Louis Brass Company and later renamed it the Edwin F. Guth Company. Mr. Guth's profound creativity, entrepreneurialism, and focus to improve interior lighting are partially represented through 147 patents awarded to him prior to his passing in 1962. This award recognizes exceptional interior lighting projects that balance the functional illumination of space with the artistic application of light to enhance the occupant's experience.

Illumination Award for Energy and Environmental Lighting Design

The Energy and Environmental Design Award recognizes quality lighting installations in commercial and industrial buildings that incorporate advanced energy saving strategies and environmentally responsible solutions into the overall design.

Illumination Award for Lighting Control Innovation

Advanced lighting control solutions can provide significant energy savings, flexibility and other benefits in buildings. This prestigious award recognizes good lighting projects that exemplify the use of lighting controls in nonresidential applications.

Illumination Award for Outdoor Lighting Design *sponsored by Cooper Lighting Solutions*

The Outdoor Lighting Design Award recognizes excellence in lighting design and application in all aspects of exterior lighting. The program celebrates achievements in aesthetics, applied technical acumen, creative solutions to demanding site conditions and advancements to the industry in outdoor lighting applications. The goal of the program is to further the understanding, knowledge and function of outdoor lighting as a critical aspect of the built environment.
